I remember getting the call from Karen, telling us that she had a possible birth mom profile for us. Then she said "She is kind of a butterfly..." (it hit me immediately that this could possibly be our son's relative, who was also adopted through the guidance and support of AAU) because this was exactly how ADs birth mom was described. My heart fluttered! Sure enough, birth mom was in fact a sister to our son's birth mom! We then waited two weeks to find out if she chose us or not, as we have always said, "it's in God's hands". We got the official news on January 12th that KP chose us to raise her baby girl as our own! There are no words to describe the feelings that came over us!

The ball definitely got rolling once KP chose us since baby was coming in April. We met in person within the next week or two. It was a great visit; I think we visited for close to 3 hours. We all gave hugs goodbye and discussed the next time that we might see each other might be in the delivery room, which was crazy to think. We were able to get together one more time before baby came and KP got to meet our son. It was a fun, but quick visit per usual when you have a toddler at a restaurant! Ha!

Then we got the call! She is in labor and heading to the hospital, so get on the road! Ha! KP had made her birth plan which did involve me being in the delivery room and cutting the cord, but as Coleen says "anything can change on the day". They sure did! Both my husband and I were able to be in the delivery room and witness the birth of MD! Again, no words to describe anything that happens at that moment or after. Eventually they did get us moved up to our rooms. We were able to be in a room close to KP. Baby MD went back and forth between our rooms during the day and we alternated nights. We tried to give KP her time with baby MD, but we were fortunate enough to have supper in her room the second night and it was WONDERFUL! We talked, and laughed and just enjoyed each other's company for hours. I think we finally headed back to our room at 11pm! That time together was truly a gift for all of us and we got some great pics! The best way to describe that time was a family reunion.

We were able to discharge together and that was very difficult. Lots of hugs and tears. There is really no preparing for that, but everybody at AAU is wonderful with helping the birth moms grieve the adoption. We have been fortunate enough that we have been able to keep in touch with KP on a very regular basis. It has been so very rewarding; getting to know her and more about her.; being able to send her pics of MD and hearing her response. We have even been able to visit a couple of times in person. Many times, our talks are not even about MD, just about what's going on in life. Being able to talk about our faith, scripture verses that hit us in a certain way that day or week. It has been encouraging for us as adoptive parents, that KP is proud of how we are raising MD. We talk about getting together for holidays or just family gatherings and hoping to meet other family members. The future is bright and we are beyond blessed! 
"I am doing well, I love my relationship the  ${ t D}$  family!! AAU has made a big impact on my life."

#### WHAT IS AASK?

Adults Adopting Special Kids (AASK) program is North Dakota's state foster care adoption program providing services to children in foster care and to the families who adopt them. AASK's mission is to build permanency for these children through adoption by committed, stable, and nurturing families. Catholic Charities North Dakota has a contract with the North Dakota Department of Human Services to deliver adoption services to children and families across the state.

Catholic Charities reached out to AAU in 2023 to assist with conducting home assessments. To date, All About U has completed 10 home assessments, assisting those families with establishing permanency for 13 kids.

A note from Codie our resident ND Social worker regarding AASK:

What has been the most surprising thing for you?

The most surprising thing has been how much I have learned and grown both as a social worker and human from being welcomed into each and every home and learning about the unending commitment from these families to the children. The strength I have seen has given me a whole knew perspective on parent's commitment and determination to provide permanency that every child deserves. The journey both the child and family has been on is such that most of us could not fathom but they do it with dignity, grace, and honor. Each family has done more than opening their door for each child, they hold their hand through the storm and provide them with a beautiful rainbow and the truly inspiring thing I have witnessed is how each child has actually provided the family the most beautiful rainbow. It has taught me to truly open my eyes to what a family means and what looks difficult is more often than not the start of something so breathtakingly beautiful.
